New Faculty and Guests for Summer 2006



Dr. Charlie Self (B.A., M.A., Ph.D. University of California at Santa Cruz; M.A., Graduate Theological Union) is teaching at AGTS for the first time this summer. A scholar of great breadth and remarkable popular energy, he has always served as a pastor while pursuing an impressive academic career. He has also distinguished himself as an author and public communicator. He is known as “Dr. History” for his regular appearances on the Brian Sussman talk-radio show on KSFO 560 AM in San Francisco, in which he “provides humorous and insightful facts to guide the perplexed toward sanity.” He is also a professor of ethics at Western Theological Seminary and will be teaching **PHIM 633 *Ethical Issues in Contemporary Society*** in modular format at AGTS on May 22-26. Sparkling intellect and a great sense of humor never hurt a summer class.



Dr. David Bundrick (B.A. Southeastern College; M.Div. Assemblies of God Theological Seminary; Th.M. Princeton Theological Seminary; Ph.D. University of Missouri—Columbia) is Vice-President for Student Development at Evangel University. He is a New Testament scholar who has published in the *Journal of the Evangelical Theological Society* as well as other venues, and he has a strong record as a minister and as a leader in Assemblies of God higher education, having served for many years in the Department of Christian Higher Education. He combines passion for the Biblical text with hands-on involvement with people. This summer he will teach **BNT542/BGR 627 *Epistles of Peter***.



Dr. David Lim (B.A. Bethany College; M.Div., D.Min., Golden Gate Baptist Theological Seminary) is Senior Pastor of Grace A/G in Singapore, a multi-lingual church with a total of ten weekend worship services in English, Cantonese, Hokkien, Mandarin, and Filipino. He has served as President of Asia Pacific Theological Seminary, Philippines; and has pastored for twenty-four years. He is the author of *Spiritual Gifts—A Fresh Look* published by GPH. He also contributed chapters to *Systematic Theology—A Pentecostal Perspective* and *Pentecostal Pastor*. He will teach **PTHM/BTHM/PCSM 640 *Theology & Practice of Spiritual Gifts***, a D.Min. course that is being made available to master’s level students on June 12-15. This course is offered every year and has helped many students enter into active ministry in the charismatic gifts.
